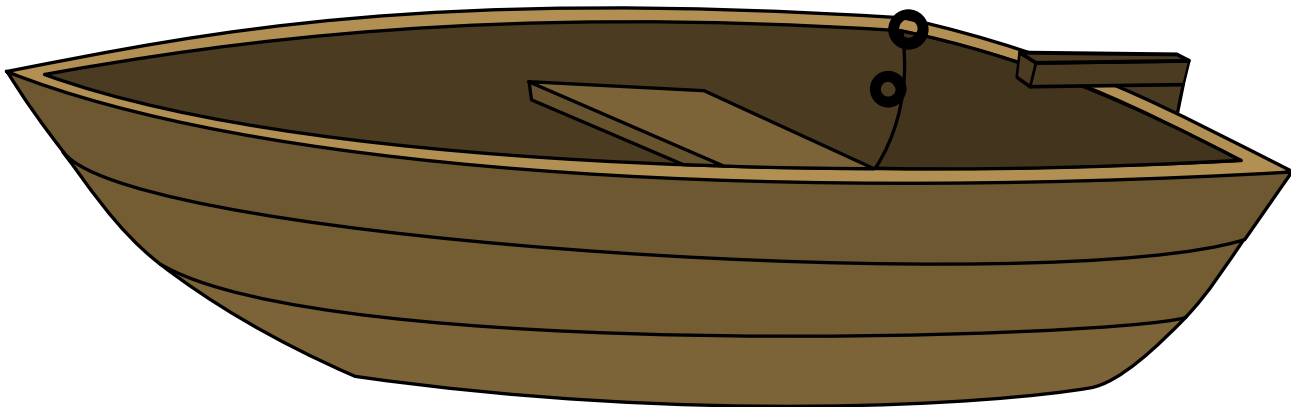
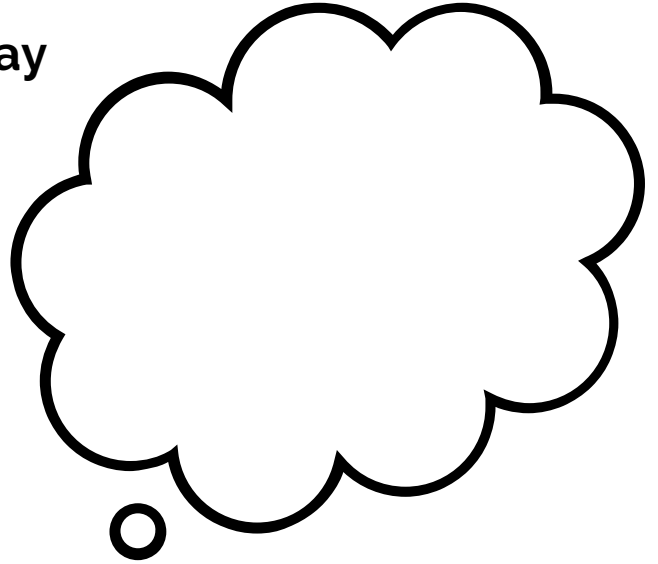




ANZAC Day
