

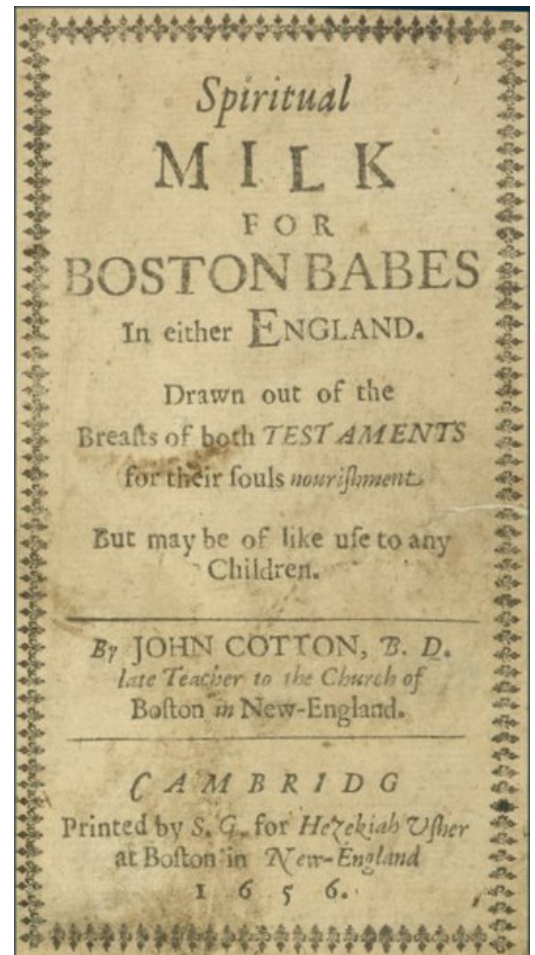


Book Week!

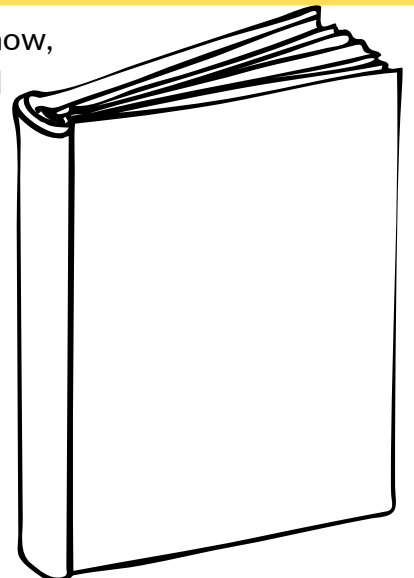
1. Ask permission to search online and learn what the Puritans banned, and insisted on, in their new colony.
