

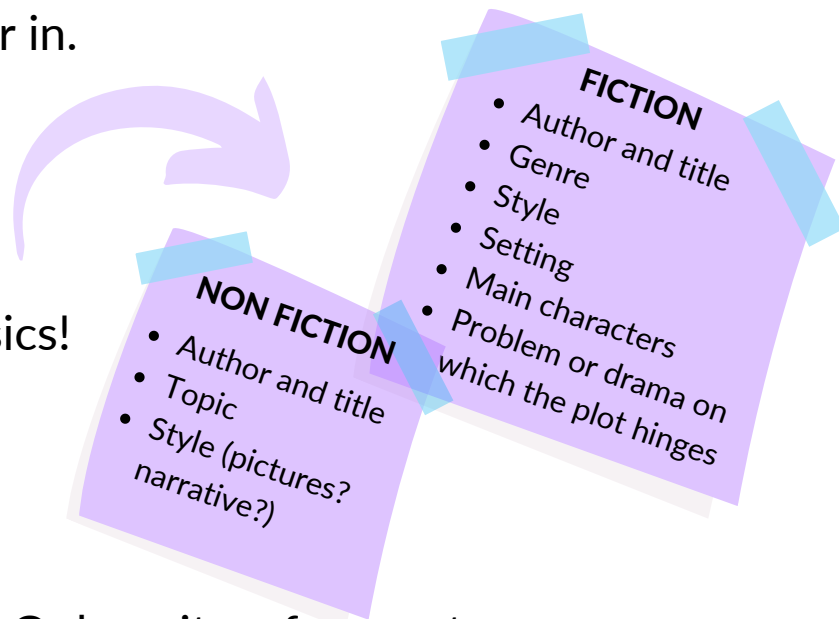


Catch's Guide to Book Reviews



Start out with a question, a surprising fact, or some other way of drawing your listener in.

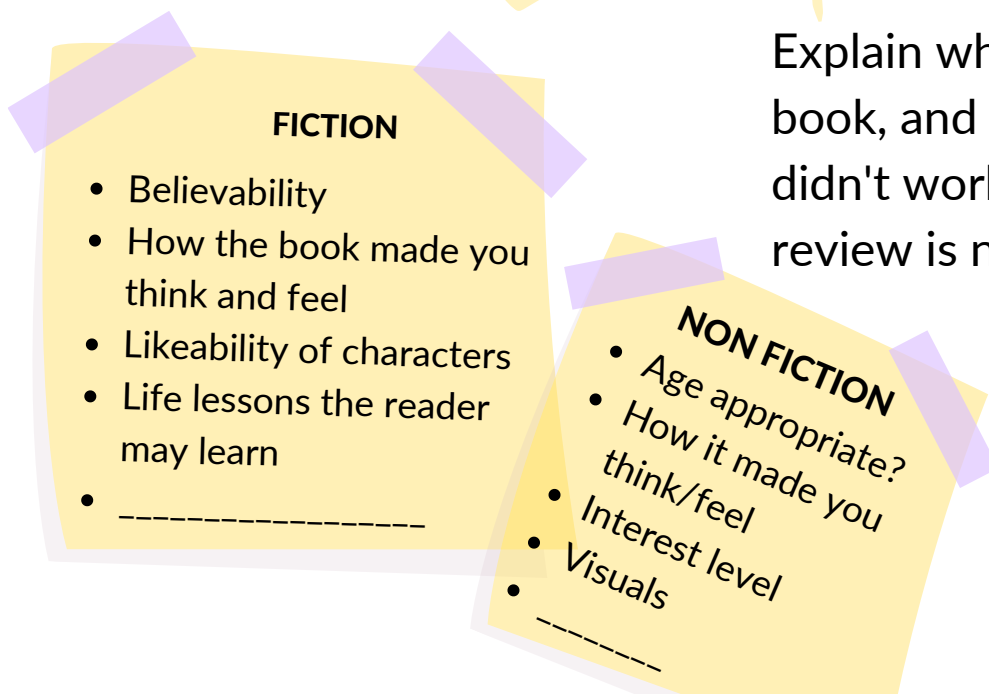
Remember to cover the basics!



No spoilers! No summaries! Only write a few sentences explaining what the book is about.



Explain what's great about the book, and what (if anything) didn't work for you. Remember, a review is not an advertisement!





How to record your podcast:



Listen to some of the book reviews already on the Squiz Kids website. Listen carefully to the reviewers':

- tone
- speed
- voice clarity

Practice your review a couple of times, so that it's smooth.

Ask to use a phone or tablet.

Open (or download) a simple, free, voice recording app.

Find a quiet place that doesn't echo. The bathroom is not good! Under your doona is surprisingly good, but keep still!

Do a test recording of your first three sentences. Keep the device still, and don't cover the microphone! Listen back. Do you need to hold the microphone closer? Slow down?

Once you're happy with your sound, record! If you make a mistake, just go back to the beginning of that sentence and start again. We can edit out the mistake!
