Now - no one was hurt in the creation of this hoax - but it points to a bigger problem - and one which our friend Squiz-E the Newshound is always warning us about.

Namely, that as technology advances and AI becomes cleverer, photos can be created of things that never happened, and videos can also be made showing things that never occurred.

And as the video that I've linked to in today's episode notes talks about - with 64 elections taking place around the world this year alone - there's

a very good chance that lots of mis and disinformation will be floating about that could affect the outcomes of who wins government in these countries. And that is a big deal.
