Santa:

Hohohoho ... why yes it is? Is that you Bryce? My elves said you'd be phoning ...

BC:

Yes! It's me! Calling you all the way from Australia ... I can't believe I'm actually speaking to you!

Santa:

(chuckles) Ahh yes ... it's definitely me. It's so lovely to hear your voice. How's the weather down there in Australia?

BC:

Well Santa, it's hot. As I am sure you know - it's summer down here. We're about as far removed from the snow and ice of the North Pole as it's possible to be ...

Santa:

(chuckles) Ah yes ... an Aussie Christmas ... there's nothing quite like it in the world. I have special air conditioning installed in the sleigh for when I visit Australia - and I always make sure to make plenty of stops for the reindeer to drink plenty of water ...

BC:

Oh Santa ... you don't know how excited we all are down here. It's our favourite time of the year here at Squiz Kids. And I can't believe there's only two more sleeps until Christmas morning ... now, can I just ask whether I've made the naughty or nice list this year? I've been doing my best to behave ...

Santa:

Hmmm ... let's see (taps on keyboard) - everything is very modern these days .. I've got all the kids of the world in a database ... CORBETT, Bryce Ahhh yes -

here you are. Well it looks like you had a bit of a naughty spell back in July and August, but according to your parents and the Elf on Your Shelf - you've been trying really hard to be a good boy ...

BC:

BC:

Wow ... so many jobs ... and so many elves. So here's a question now from 7yo Gus from the ACT ..

How do you decide who's on the naughty and nice list?

Santa:

Ahh Gus ... what an excellent question. And it's one I get asked A LOT! And do you know what? I'm going to let you in on a little secret. I rely on your parents and teachers to help me out with that one. Towards the end of every year, I ask them to email me a behaviour update - to let me know whether you've been generally well behaved or whether you've been misbehaving. Now, I know, kids can't be good ALL the time ... but if you've been naughty more often than you've been nice - you can be sure I'll find out about it.

BC:

I'm sure you will, Santa ... ok, popping over to Western Australia now where we have a somewhat related question from Oscar ...

Does Elf on the shelf watch us? Oscar, Beaconsfield WA

Good question Oscar ... I have to say, ever since Elf On The Shelf has made its way into homes all over the world, my naughty and nice lists have gotten even more detailed. Those elves see all sorts of things - and they're pretty good at letting me know whether you've been a good kid and listened to your parents and teachers. Or whether you've been naughty. BC:

BC:

Santa:
