everywhere, health officials are warning people to be careful—small cuts and scratches can lead to serious infections.

## SPIN THE GLOBE

Each day we give the world globe a spin and find a news story from wherever it stops, and today we've landed in an old flooded quarry on the border of Wales and England, where scientists are working on a mind-blowing project—living under the sea!

A team of experts is building underwater pods called sentinels, designed to be lowered 200 metres beneath the ocean—deep into the twilight zone, where sunlight fades and strange deep-sea creatures roam. Think glowing jellyfish, vampire squid, and animals so bizarre they look like aliens!

More than 90% of ocean life exists within 200 metres of the surface, yet we've only explored about 20% of it. That's why the team behind Deep is working to make long-term underwater living a reality, allowing scientists—and maybe even tourists—to explore like never before.

And it's not just the ocean hiding secrets! Scientists in the United States and Germany have also found life thriving up to 4 kilometres underground, conserving their energy and moving so slowly that some microbes only divide once every thousand years.

If there's still so much to uncover beneath our feet and below the waves... I wonder what might we discover next?

#### ANIMAL KINGDOM

Well folks, they say curiosity leads to discovery—but sometimes, what you find is more than you bargained for...

During the filming of the British nature show Winterwatch, researchers stumbled upon something creepy and completely new—a fungus that takes over the minds of spiders! Yep, you heard right... a spider controlling zombie fungus. Terrifying!

Deep in a cave on an Irish island, they spotted an orb-weaving cave spider acting strangely. It had left its usual hiding spot and crawled out into the open—where it had died in a very exposed position.

With the help of a local cave expert (a speleologist, if you want a cool new word), more infected spiders were found in caves across Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

But here's the freakiest part—the fungus controls the spiders' behaviour, making them leave their safe, shadowy webs and move to open spaces where the fungus can spread its spores. It's a bit like the zombie-ant fungus found in Brazil's rainforests.

So, next time you walk into a cave... who knows what tiny, mind-controlling creatures might be lurking in the dark? Actually, I might just stay out of caves altogether.
