(story about surfing, fear)

You must really have loved surfing to keep heading out there! So, how on earth did you go from that level of fear, to doing a PhD on sharks?

(studying parrot fish, seeing a shark, appreciating their adaptations)

So you switched what you were focusing on at uni?

(story of changing habits at uni; studying harder)

I guess that's a great lesson—if you find something you're passionate about, it will be easy to work hard! So WHAT are some of the weirdest and coolest things you've learned about sharks?

**WHAT** 

What is one of the biggest differences between sharks and other fish?

(What exactly IS a shark; give birth to live young; one 90cm shark that gives birth to a 45cm baby - like having a 9 year old; cannibalistic pups)

What's the weirdest shark out there, do you think?

(Cookie cutter shark)

What can humans learn from sharks?

(dermal denticles inspiring swimmer design)

It's so clear talking to you that you really appreciate and love sharks. What would you say to kids like are just like you once were - deathly afraid of sharks?

(More than 600 species; most have no interest in "hairless land monkeys" - love this phrase. More likely to die walking to the beach. etc.)

Now, we think of sharks as being at the top of the ocean's food chain - all-powerful predators. But about half of all shark species are endangered. WHY on earth is that?

WHY

So Adrian, are sharks endangered because humans are killing them?

(Sharks as by-catch; sharks caught because they eat what tuna eat)

And why does that matter, if we have fewer sharks in our oceans?

(eco-system... fewer sharks throws everything out of balance. Analogy of lions in the jungle)

Which sharks are in the greatest danger right now?

(Talk about your faves, hammerheads, here)

So what can regular people do about all this? We don't run a fishery, so how can we help?

(Look for the blue tick; don't eat shark fin soup; etc).
