They're in your torch, your tablet, and your TV remote, but not all batteries are small. This week, one of the world's largest batteries was switched on in Australia, designed to help power thousands of homes.

It's called the Waratah Super Battery, and it's the size of eight AFL fields. It's been built on the site of an old coal-fired power station on the New South Wales Central Coast, and it's set to play a huge role in Australia's shift from coal to cleaner energy.

With more Aussies installing rooftop solar than almost anywhere in the world, we're generating heaps of power during the day. But that's not when we need it most. Big batteries like Waratah help store solar energy for when people get home and crank up the lights, TVs and ovens.

We've got a podcast series all about renewable energy coming in Term Four, so stay tuned.

And from energy on Earth to energy in space... NASA has fast-tracked plans to build a nuclear reactor on the Moon to power future lunar bases. Earlier this year, China and Russia said they plan to build one by 2035, so it's a bit of a space race. But launching

nuclear material into space comes with safety risks, and some scientists say we need clear rules to protect the Moon for everyone.

At the Palace of Versailles, once home to French royalty and the famous Sun King, Louis XIV, some of the garden's ancient statues have found their voice, thanks to artificial intelligence.

With a quick scan of a QR code and a smartphone app, visitors can now chat with twenty statues and fountains, and ask them to spill juicy secrets, fun facts, and tales of palace life.

These gardens are packed with more than 800 sculptures, many inspired by mythical gods like Apollo and Neptune. But now, instead of just posing, some are telling their side of the story.

It's history with a high-tech twist, and possibly the only time it's OK to talk to a statue and not look silly.
