THE LOWDOWN

What if I told you that schools were banning birthday cakes, starting next week?

Or that Minecraft servers were shutting down FOREVER?

Or even that your favourite footy team had been kicked out of the comp overnight?

Totally untrue... but did your tummy do a little flip? Did you feel a spark of "Wait... WHAT?!"

If so, you've just been hit with something called rage bait. And it's just been crowned the Oxford University Press Word of the Year.

Rage bait is any online post designed to make people angry or upset, because anger gets clicks. And comments. And arguments. And that means more engagement...which is what social media platforms love.

Oxford's language experts choose a Word of the Year to capture what the world's talking about. This year, more than 30,000 people voted, and the experts picked "rage bait" because it exploded in use during 2025, thanks to big conversations about online safety, misinformation, and how tech can manipulate our emotions.

Other frontrunners included aura farming — when someone carefully curates a supercool online vibe — and biohack, which is all about using lifestyle tweaks or tech to try to improve your body or brain

Which just goes to show... the words we use don't just describe the world — they help tell the story of it.

SPIN THE GLOBE

Each day we give the world globe a spin and find a news story from wherever it stops... and today we've landed in Dublin, Ireland — where one of the world's most famous libraries is having a massive clearout.

Warning...I'm going full Library Geek on you — proudly — because what is IMO the world's most fabulous library - Trinity College Dublin's Old Library - is about to close for a gigantic restoration. And when I say gigantic... I mean hundreds of thousands of books being carefully moved, cleaned, tagged, and tucked away while the 300-year-old building gets a makeover.

For the first time since the 1700s, the famous Long Room, with its dark oak shelves, arched wooden ceiling and rows of ancient books, is almost empty. Staff wearing gloves and dust masks have already packed up nearly 200,000 books, gently vacuuming, measuring, and tagging them so they can be stored safely in climate-controlled rooms. Staff say that with the weight of the books removed, the 300-year-old building physically shifted - floorboards creaked, timber joints eased, and tiny nails rose slightly from the boards.

Some books are older than the library itself, including the Book of Kells - one of Ireland's greatest treasures, a 1,200-year-old handwritten and hand-painted copy of the Christian Gospels; a copy of Shakespeare's First Folio; and even the first book ever printed in the Irish language.

The best bit? They're digitising the whole collection, so anyone, anywhere in the world can explore it online.

SPORT TIME

If I told you we were all heading outside for a game of dodgeball, would you be out of your seat in about three seconds? Okay... but what if I told you we were going to play for two whole days and nights, non-stop? Still keen?

That's exactly what 24 dodgeball players from across the United Kingdom have just done at The Dodgeball Centre in Hartlepool, England. The athletes, from England, Scotland, Wales and Ireland, played from 9am Saturday until 9am Monday, aiming to break the Guinness World Record for the longest-ever dodgeball match and raise money for charity while they were at it.

The previous record was just over 41 hours, set back in 2012. This team smashed past it shortly after 2 am Monday and kept going until they hit the full 48 hours.

Players were allowed short breaks and quick naps, but otherwise, it was dodge, duck, dip, and dive the whole way through. The marathon match was filmed, livestreamed and watched by official witnesses, and now Guinness is reviewing all the evidence before confirming the new world record.

Kids shared all kinds of opinions — from worries about staying connected with friends, to mental health concerns, to worries about privacy and safety. But one comment really stopped Squiz-E in his tracks.

One 10-year-old wrote: "They shouldn't be banning us. They should be teaching us."

Whilst a ban is coming, learning how to spot dodgy posts, question what you see, and stay safe online is still the most powerful tool of all.
