

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

“PM For A Day” Competition

1. Promoter

1.1 The promoter is **Squiz Media Pty Ltd** (ABN: 19 616 204 052.) of PO Box 1299 Potts Point NSW 1335, Australia.

2. Competition Overview

2.1 This competition is a game of skill. Chance plays no part in determining the winner.

2.2 Eligible entrants are invited to submit a short video explaining what they would do if they were “PM For A Day”.

2.3 One (1) winner will be selected on merit.

2.4 The winner and one (1) parent or legal guardian will travel to Canberra to attend a Squiz Kids event at Parliament House on 31 March 2026.

3. Competition Period

Opens: 24 February 2026 at 9:00am AEDT

Closes: 13 March 2026 at 11:59pm AEDT

Entries received outside this period will not be accepted.

4. Eligibility

4.1 Entry is open to children aged seven (7) to thirteen (13) years inclusive at the time of entry.

4.2 Entrants must be residents of Australia, including the Australian Capital Territory.

4.3 Entry must be submitted by the entrant’s parent or legal guardian.

4.4 Employees of the Promoter and their immediate family members are ineligible.

4.5 Limit of one (1) entry per child.

4.6 The winner must be available to travel to Canberra and attend the event at Parliament House on 31 March 2026.

4.7 The winner and their parent/guardian must be willing to participate in media recording and related promotional activity in connection with the event.

5. Entry Requirements

5.1 Entrants must submit a video of approximately thirty (30) seconds in MP4 format in portrait orientation.

5.2 The video must follow this format:

“Hi, my name is [X], I am [X] years old, and I live in [X]. If I were PM For A Day, the one thing I would do to make Australia a better place is...”

5.3 Videos must not:

- (a) Contain offensive, defamatory or unlawful content;
- (b) Promote or endorse a specific political party, political candidate, or campaign;
- (c) Contain copyrighted music or third-party intellectual property without permission;
- (d) Breach any law or regulation.

5.4 The Promoter reserves the right to verify eligibility and disqualify any entrant who does not comply with these Terms and Conditions.

6. Judging

6.1 Judging will take place between 14 March 2026 and 18 March 2026.

6.2 Entries will be judged by a panel appointed by the Promoter.

6.3 Entries will be assessed on creativity, imagination, vision, originality and charisma.

6.4 The judges' decision is final and binding. No correspondence will be entered into.

7. Prize

7.1 The prize consists of:

- (a) Two (2) return economy airfares to Canberra booked by the Promoter from an Australian capital city or regional centre determined by the Promoter;
- (b) Two (2) nights' accommodation in Canberra in a twin-share room at a hotel of at least three (3) star rating selected by the Promoter;

- (c) Ground transfers in Canberra, with reimbursement capped at \$320 upon provision of valid receipts within four (4) weeks of the event;
- (d) Meals during the stay comprising two (2) breakfasts, two (2) dinners and one (1) lunch to a total maximum value of \$470;
- (e) Attendance at the Squiz Kids event at Parliament House on 31 March 2026.

7.2 Total prize value is approximately AUD \$2,700.

7.3 If the winner resides within 100 kilometres of Canberra, flights will not be provided and the winner's parent/guardian will arrange their own transport to and from Canberra.

7.4 The prize is not transferable, exchangeable or redeemable for cash.

7.5 Travel dates are fixed.

7.6 The Promoter reserves the right to substitute the prize (or part thereof) with one of equal or greater value if reasonably necessary.

7.7 The Promoter may, at its discretion, award minor non-cash prizes to runners-up. There is no obligation to award such prizes.

8. Travel and Event Conditions

8.1 The winner must be accompanied at all times by their parent or legal guardian.

8.2 The parent/guardian is solely responsible for supervision and care of the child at all times.

8.3 Access to Parliament House is subject to security requirements and the direction of Parliamentary authorities.

8.4 The winner and parent/guardian must comply with all reasonable directions, security screening processes and identification requirements.

8.5 The winner and parent/guardian may be required to sign additional consent, release and indemnity forms prior to travel.

9. Force Majeure

9.1 If the event, travel, flights, accommodation or access to Parliament House is cancelled, restricted, delayed or modified due to circumstances beyond the Promoter's reasonable control — including but not limited to government directives, security restrictions, airline cancellations, industrial disputes, natural disasters, public health emergencies or acts of Parliament — the Promoter may:

- (a) Modify the prize;
- (b) Reschedule the event; or
- (c) Cancel the prize in whole or in part.

9.2 To the extent permitted by law, the Promoter will not be liable for any such cancellation, delay or modification.

10. Intellectual Property and Media Consent

10.1 By submitting an entry, the entrant's parent/guardian grants the Promoter a non-exclusive, worldwide, royalty-free licence to use, reproduce, edit and publish the submitted video for the duration of the promotion and any related editorial coverage or media interest arising from the competition.

10.2 The Promoter will not use non-winning entries in paid advertising campaigns.

10.3 The licence granted under clause 10.1 does not transfer ownership of the entrant's intellectual property.

10.4 No compensation will be payable beyond the prize.

10.5 By submitting an entry, the parent/guardian consents to the Promoter using the child's name, image and voice in connection with the promotion.

11. Privacy

11.1 The Promoter collects personal information in accordance with the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth).

11.2 Personal information of entrants under 15 years of age will be handled with heightened protections and only with parental consent.

11.3 Personal information will be used for:

- (a) Administering the competition;
- (b) Contacting the winner;
- (c) Arranging travel and event participation.

11.4 By entering, parent/guardians consent to receiving marketing communications from the Promoter. They may opt out at any time by:

- (a) Using the unsubscribe link in communications; or

12. Winner Notification

12.1 Shortlisted candidates will be contacted via email before March 16, 2026.

12.1 The winner will be notified by email on 19 March 2026.

12.2 The winner must accept the prize within twenty four (24) hours of notification.

12.3 If the winner does not respond within twenty four (24) hours or is unable to travel, the Promoter may select the next highest-ranked entrant.

13. Indemnity and Limitation of Liability

13.1 To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Promoter excludes all liability for any loss, damage, injury, cost or expense (including indirect or consequential loss) suffered or incurred by any entrant, winner or accompanying parent/guardian arising out of or in connection with:

- (a) Participation in the competition;
- (b) Acceptance or use of the prize;
- (c) Travel to or from Canberra;
- (d) Airline cancellation, delay or modification;
- (e) Event cancellation or modification;
- (f) Acts or omissions of third-party service providers including airlines, hotels and transport operators.

13.2 The Promoter does not provide travel insurance and is not responsible for arranging travel insurance. It is the responsibility of the winner's parent/guardian to obtain any insurance they consider necessary.

13.3 The winner's parent/guardian agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Promoter, its directors, employees and agents from any claim, loss or liability arising from their participation in the prize or travel associated with it, except to the extent caused by the Promoter's negligence.

13.4 Nothing in these Terms excludes, restricts or modifies any consumer guarantee or other right under the Australian Consumer Law or any other applicable legislation that cannot lawfully be excluded.

14. Government Disclaimer

14.1 This competition is not endorsed by the Australian Federal Government, the Office of the Governor-General, or the Parliament of Australia.

14.2 Access to Parliament House is facilitated administratively but may be withdrawn or modified at any time without liability to the Promoter.

15. General Conditions

15.1 The Promoter reserves the right to verify the validity of entries.

15.2 The Promoter is not responsible for technical malfunctions or email transmission failures.

15.3 If any provision of these Terms is invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions remain in force.

16. Governing Law and Dispute Resolution

16.1 These Terms are governed by the laws of New South Wales, Australia.

16.2 Any dispute arising under these Terms shall first be subject to good faith negotiation. If unresolved within fourteen (14) days, the dispute shall be referred to mediation in New South Wales before any court proceedings are commenced.
